Important Information:

- Sophomore, junior, or senior students with a minimum GPA of 3.5 or higher are eligible to apply. Members must maintain a 3.5 cumulative GPA.
- Complete all sections. Do not leave anything blank.
- Do not be modest! This is a time to share your accomplishments so that the Faculty Council can evaluate your application. Provide as much information as possible and the greatest variety of examples as you can. You may include additions to the tables if necessary on a separate page.
- Do not reuse the same information in two different sections. For example, if you have been a peer tutor use it for Leadership if you have other examples to use for Service, but fewer Leadership activities.
- **Completed applications are due by September 7th at 3pm.** to Ms. Reph. Late applications are not accepted.
- Completion of the application does not guarantee selection.

Selection Criteria: Selection for membership is by a Faculty Council who review applications in a blind manner to judge a student's demonstration of the following: **Scholarship, Leadership, Character, and Service.** Each quality will receive a score. A student must receive a certain score to be selected. A student's school disciplinary records and any criminal offences will affect the character score. Any student who does not score high enough on the rubric will be allowed to reapply the following year as long as he or she still maintains an eligible GPA.
